UPGRADING ALARM TEST: Every Saturday at 12:05pm, the U1 alarm is tested. No evacuation required.

INDUSTRIAL WIRELESS BADGE REPLACEMENT: Panic button functionality of green tape badges will end July 14th with the completion of 2018 spring post work. If you are supporting the 2018 fall maintenance event, please return your existing wireless badge for a new one with a <u>blue protective seal</u>. Replacements can be picked up in UOB office #203 starting July 1,2018. Thank you for your cooperation and support of this important program.

WORK WITHIN THE PERMIT SYSTEM: Before beginning your work, please ensure you have the correct permits to proceed and that they are properly filled out, signed and also include specific details relating to your work scope. Work within the limits of your permit and never change the scope of the task without authorization from the Operations permit centre.

STAY FOCUSED THIS CANADA DAY LONG WEEKEND: It's the Canada Day long weekend and with this comes the potential for an increase in incidents and injury. Please keep your mind on the task at hand and stay in the moment for the entire shift this weekend. Be aware of your surroundings and identify all hazards in your work area as part of your Field Level Hazard Assessment (FLHA). Once hazards have been identified, take immediate action to eliminate or mitigate each. If more time is required to correct the hazardous situation, you should contact your foreman to ensure the hazardous area is flagged off.
